Strikes Against Hunger Bowling Tournament

Assured Life Association plans to sponsor a Team “mail-in” bowling tournament to benefit Feeding America if a sufficient number of members wish to participate in such an event. It seems appropriate to have this bowling tournament this year considering 2017 marks the 50th anniversary of the very first annual National Bowling Tournament sponsored by the Society.

The 1st tournament was held in Fresno, California during the weekends of August 19-20, August 26-27 and September 2-3, 1967 and soon became a very popular national member event; having expanded to a Bowling and Golf Tournament the 2nd year and later a Bowling, Golf and Tennis Tournament. The Society even included Darts and Bingo in the final years of the event. The Annual Labor Day Tournament, as it became known, was held for 33

years. This year, a mail-in event only, members and their friends and family will register with the home office to bowl for a nominal fee (\$60.00 per team). We would have to play it by ear this first year with all male, female and mixed teams being placed in one tournament pool, but the winning team would win \$260.

Teams would get together on their own and bowl 3 games. Tournament rules and guidelines and score sheets will be provided each team after they register.


All profits will be donated to Feeding America to help in that organization’s mission to end hunger in conjunction with Assured Life Association’s National Member Food Drive.



It reverts back to the old adage, “Do unto others as you want others to do unto you.”
